The Queen Street High school Tigers ended a successful tour by winning five out of six games played. Their only defeat was handed to them by the Rockingham High school.

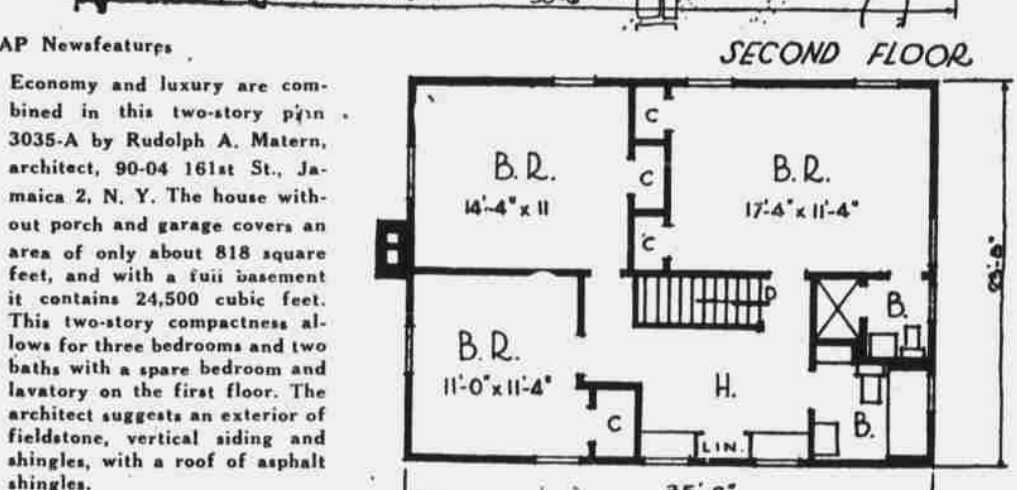
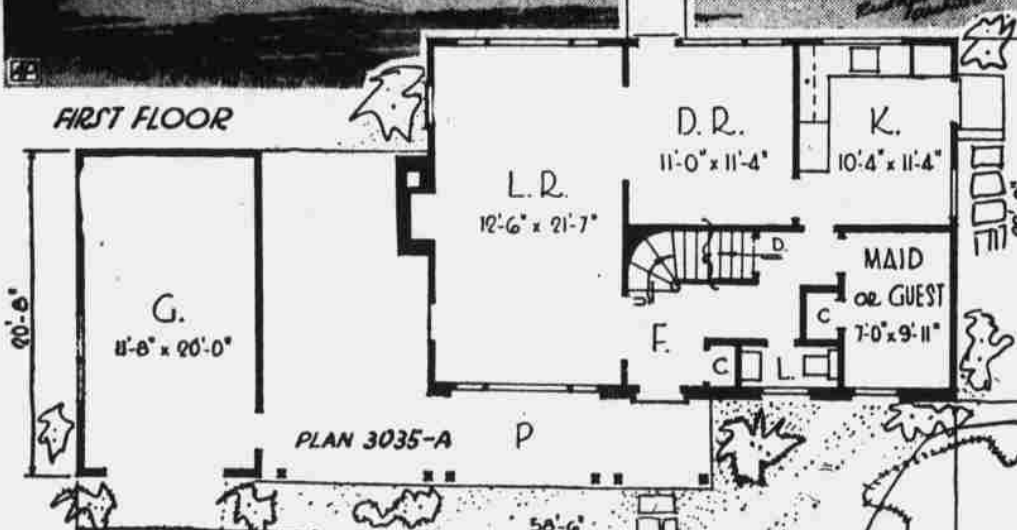

This two-story compactness allows for three bedrooms and two baths with a spare bedroom and lavatory on the first floor. The architect suggests an exterior of fieldstone, vertical siding and shingles, with a roof of asphalt shingles.
