Commerce has informed J. Melville Broughton, United States senator, that it opposes the proposed federal legislation to raise the minimum wage, which stands now at 40 cents an hour.

The Chamber of Commerce objects on the basis that the Fair Labor Standards act, now being considered in Congress, insofar as it deals with the minimum wage. is merely an inflationary measure. Mr. Broughton's letter, in reply to the Chamber's opinion on the matter, is as follows:

. It is apparent that the bill will be acted on in the House of Representatives first.
