Mr. and Mrs. Geo. W. Ball and Miss Lena Ball motored to Newport Wednesday evening.

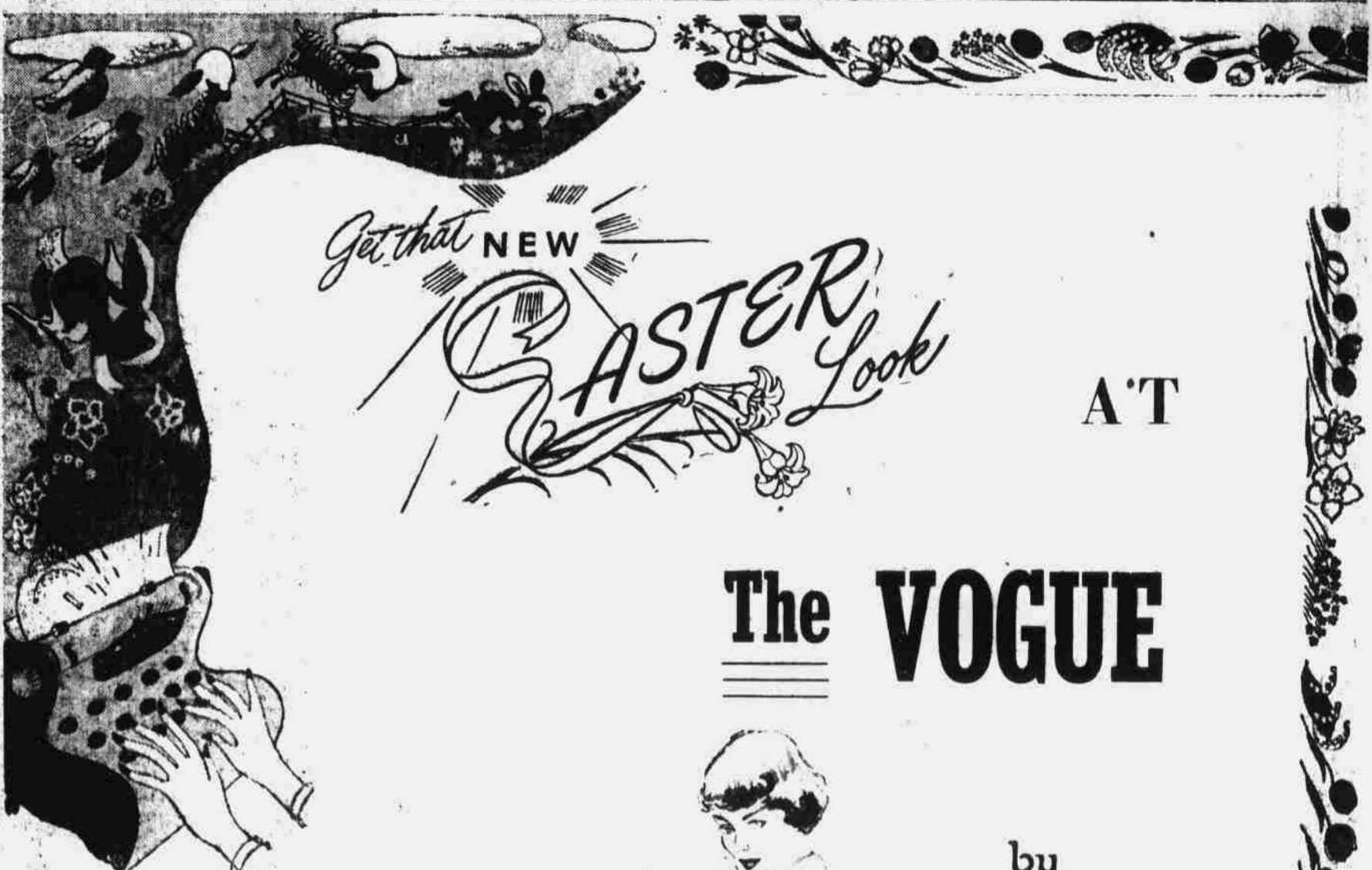
Mr. and Mrs. Reginald Adams of Cherry Point were in the community Wednesday evening.
