

# President R. S. Eudy Releases Baseball Schedule

## Kings and Queens of the Basketball Court

The schedule for 1949 baseball games in the Tidewater league was released today by Ralph Eudy, Beaufort, president of the league.

The big opening day of the league will be Saturday, April 23, and the final game before playoffs, Sunday, August 21. As has been the custom in past years, teams will play a home-and-home schedule, one team playing at the other's home field on Saturday and then this team going to their Saturday opponent's field on the next day, Sunday.

Accordingly, the schedule printed below lists Saturday games only. To get the schedule of Sunday games, reverse the Saturday schedule.

For instance, Newport plays at Beaufort and Morehead City plays at Marshallberg on Saturday, April 23. On Sunday, April 24, Beaufort plays at Newport and Marshallberg plays at Morehead City.

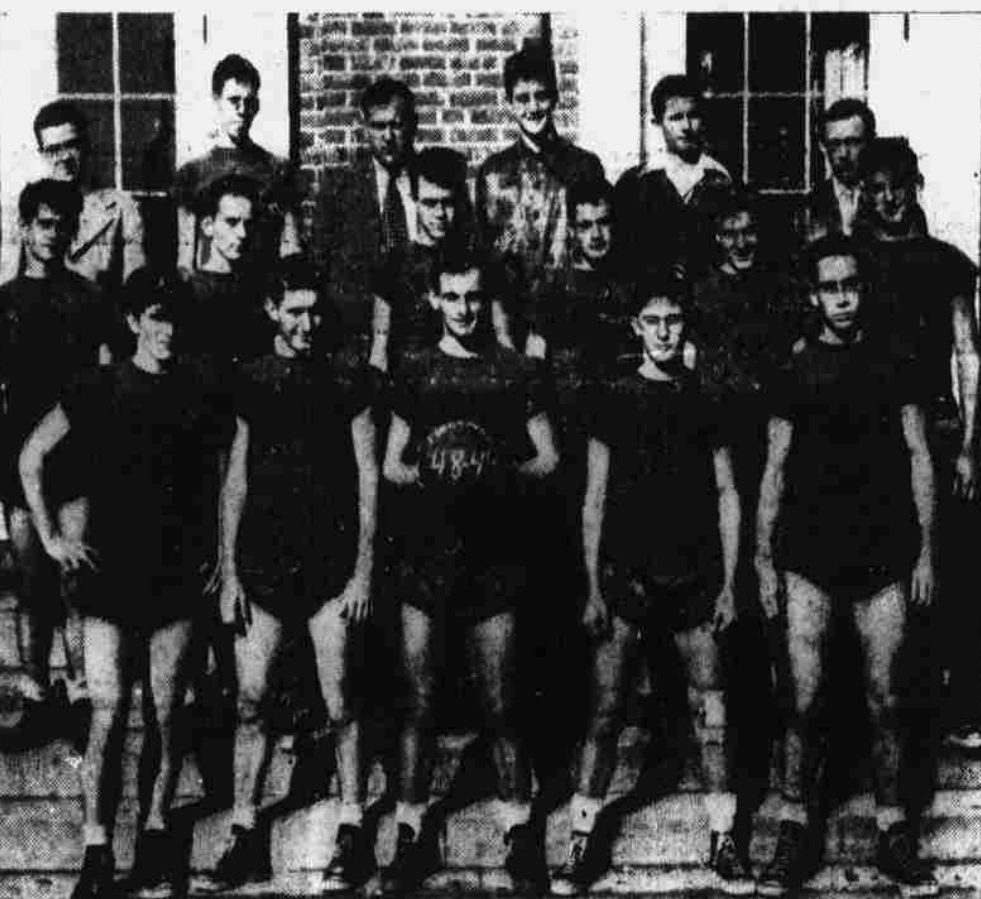

### Six Teams Join Softball League, Morehead City

Six teams have joined the Morehead City softball league. It was announced this week. These teams are the fire department, WMBL radio station, Jaycees, Lions club, Yacht basin, and Tide Water Power company.

The six clubs have raised \$800 to install electric lights at the Morehead City ballpark next to the school.

Night games are expected to stimulate interest and make night practice possible. It will also permit men to play who could not do so during the daytime.

Work will start immediately on placing the lights which will be atop three 50-foot poles. There will be one pole along each of the foul lines and one to light the center field.

Because softball does not require as large a field as baseball, it is believed that this lighting will be adequate.

Carteret county's basketball teams which played the brand of ball that smacks of trophies are pictured here at the close of their successful 1948-49 season.

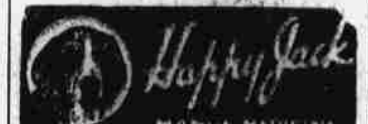

### Major Weatherly Enlists Men In National Guard

Morehead City will soon have its own unit of the National Guard when Battery B of the 449th Field Artillery battalion is activated.

Major Abigail Weatherly of the state headquarters of the Guard attended the opening of the local unit Wednesday night in the recreation center and enlisted the necessary number to activate the unit. Before complete activation can take place, however, it will be necessary for all members to undergo a physical examination and an official inspection will be made.

Captain Lonnie Dill of Morehead City is in command of the Guard unit and Lt. Wyatt Jones of New Bern is second in command. When official activation takes place the unit will have two full-time Civil Service employees to handle the records and equipment of the unit. Rifles, a truck, and clothing will be issued the men and they will use the latest type radar equipment while in camp each summer.

Membership in the local unit is not restricted to Morehead City residents but is open to any male citizen interested in joining.
