The purpose of the meeting will be to elect directors, hear reports from various corporation officers and transact routine business.

During the past three tobacco marketing seasons the Stabilization corporation has received more than 404 million pounds of tobacco from its stockholders. Tobacco men join by purchasing at least one share of common stock in the corporation and by placing tobacco in the corporation for 90 per cent of the parity support price.
