## **Cornell Studies Mud for Army**

ITHACA, N. Y. — (AP) —
A team of Cornell scientists is studying mud for the U. S. Army. They have found some hitherto unrecognized forces at work in common dirt. The purpose is to learn to strengthen soil without tons of cement, or other mixtures.
