Hybrids Produce Good Silage, Experts Report

Tests conducted during the past two years at Willard, Statesville, Waynesville, and Laurel Spines show that corn hybrids that are popular in North Carolina for grain will produce as much tonnage of silage per acre as will open pollinated varieties such as Eureka and Pamunky, the Agricultural Experiment Station reported this week.

H. L. Cooke, research instructor, and Dr. P. H. Harvey, professor of agronomy, said silage produced from hybrids also has a higher per cent of grain, especially at close spacing, than open-pollinated varieties.

On the basis of the tests, 10 to 12 inches appears to be the best spacing for silage, depending upon soil fertility and moisture.

Of the hybrids and open-pollinated varieties tested, U. S. 282 gave the best results in the up per mountain section. N. C. 27 yielded about the same total tonnage as U. S. 282, but the grain per cent and total digestible nutrients were lower since the season was too short for N. C. 27 to reach full maturity.

In the lower mountain section, N. C. 27 led other hybrids and open-pollinated varieties in both total yield and total digestible nutrients per acre.

In the Piedmont and Coastal Plain areas, Dixie 18 was the highest producer in total pounds per acre and was at the top in total digestible nutrients per acre. Since Dixie 18 requires fairly high fertility and adequate moisture, N. C. 27 probably will be more satisfactory in areas where fertility or moisture is likely to be a problem, especially on many farms in the Piedmont.

In no test did N. C. 26 or N. C. 1032 yield as much total tonnage of silage per acre as N. C. 27 with about the same grain per cent. U. S. 13 proved too early for either of the mountain areas for silage.

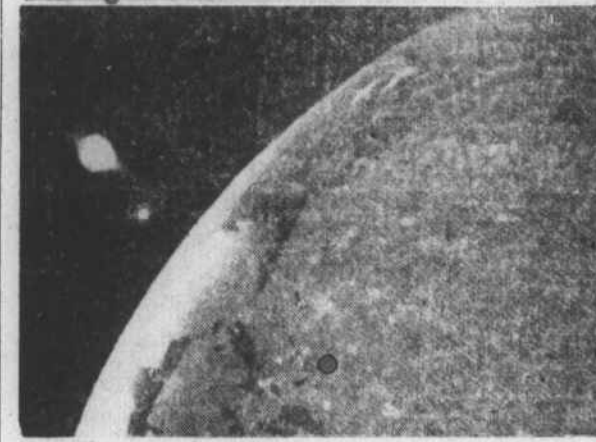

AP Newsfeatures

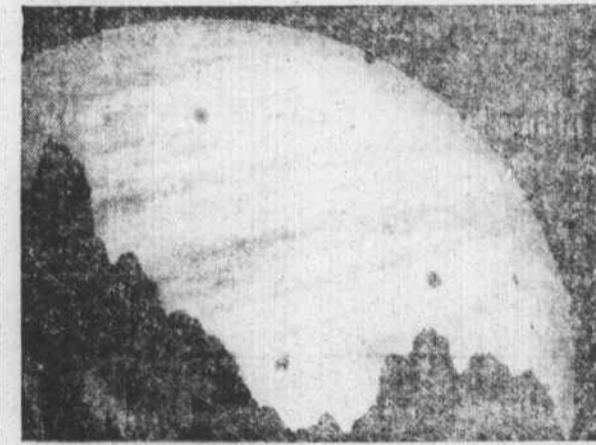

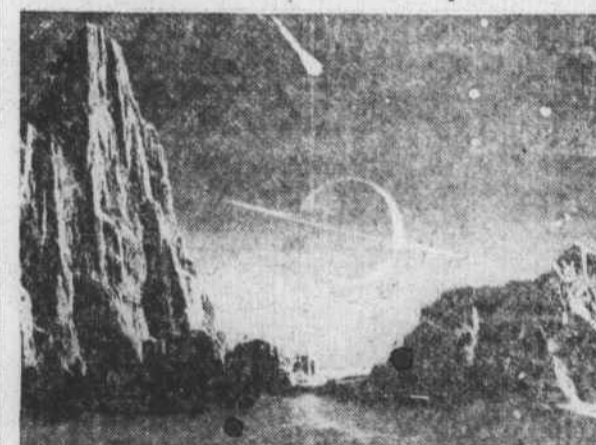
Earth — viewed from a rocket 2,099 miles away

Commercial Fishermen Take Shrimp in Haul Nets

Although the season for trawling for shrimp on inside waters does not open until July 1, there are reports of "good-sized" shrimp being taken on the inside with haul nets. Trawling for shrimp on the outside is permissible now. The season for trawling in sounds and inland waters runs from July 1 to Jan. 1.

Eastern Part Of State Produces Good Pastures

Observation of pastures in Currituck, Pasquotank, and Perquimans counties has convinced Dr. E. R. Collins, in charge of agronomy for the State College Extension service, that Eastern North Carolina can produce pastures equal to any grown in the State.

Dr. Collins recently attended pasture tours in those counties, where he observed many acres of Ladino clover-fescue and other grazing mixtures. Most encouraging part of the picture, he says, is that these pastures are being grown on land unsuited for the crops generally produced in that area.

Philip Roberts of Currituck county seeded 7 1/2 acres which had been in broomsedge, fennel, and sourgrass. He used 2 1/2 tons of lime on this low lying, poorly drained soil and fertilized with 800 pounds of 2-12-12 and 600 pounds of 0-14-14 per acre. The Ladino-fescue mixture is making excellent growth on land which normally was not returning any income to the farmer.

Another example is found on the farm of E. V. Ballance and son, where weeds higher than a 10 tractor were turned under. Charlie Roberts also has 7 1/2 acres of rough land doing nicely in Ladino and fescue.

T. C. Whitehurst, Route 3, Elizabeth City, was amazed at the way his Ladino-fescue came out after he had decided the stand was so poor it should be plowed up. He agreed to take the advice of County Agent S. L. Lowrey and wait to see what happened. Now he is glad he did, for he has a nice stand and it is growing rapidly.

Dr. Collins says in some areas less vigorous pastures are seen where farmers decided to take short cuts and leave out some of the essential steps such as liming, inoculating the seed, preparing the seedbed properly, and fertilizing.

Safety Division Emphasizes Need For Car Check-Up

RALEIGH, N. C.—Cars being driven on the streets of North Carolina in unsafe mechanical condition were cited today by the North Carolina Department of Motor Vehicles as the target of its May program of traffic safety education.

"Keeping your car in good, safe repair," said Department officials, "is very similar to keeping your teeth in good condition. Everyone agrees that it is far too easy to delay the inspection until it feels like there might be something wrong."

That "something" when it comes down to the maintenance of your car, according to the Department may result in a brake, light, or steering failure that could send you to the hospital—or worse.

"Of the 723 accidents that resulted in one or more deaths in 1949," Department officials said, "an unsafe vehicle was involved in about 47 of them. That amounts to about six per cent of the total fatal accidents."

The Department has as its slogan during this May program of traffic safety education, "Check your car . . . check accidents."

"Unsafe car conditions," Department officials said, "is extremely dangerous even when no other factor is involved. Couple bad brakes mechanism with speed too fast for conditions and you have all the ingredients of an accident—a bad one."

"Check today for such weaknesses as brakes that are not equalized, fail to hold, or that must be jammed to the floor board, head-lights that are aimed to high, too low or are cock-eyed, and for tires with cuts and fabric breaks that might blow out at any time."

As the Department put it: "The safer your car . . . the safer YOU are!"

More Parking Meters

CHICAGO (AP)—The number of communities with parking meters has more than doubled in the last three years. The Municipal Finance Officers Association, in reporting this, said meters had been installed in at least 2,240 villages, towns and cities up to the end of 1949. The association says seven cities took \$300,000 or more from them last year. The biggest take was Boston's. It collected \$485,000 from 5,000 meters.

More Lost Balls?

New York (AP)—Some scientists are working on the problem of lost golf balls and may have hit on a solution. "If manufacturers inserted a pellet of radioactive material, with life long radiation, in golf balls, inexpensive Geiger counters would locate all balls hit into the rough," says one scientist. He calls the counters "atomic caddies."
