El Gravelly of Rocky Mount, defending 1949 champion, will be unable to participate in the tourney since transportation difficulties from England where he reached the quarter-finals of the British Amateur Tournament, have kept him from reaching home in time.

Loggerhead Turtles Begin Laying Eggs on Beaches

The loggerhead egg-laying season is now underway. These giant sea turtles are moving in from the warm waters of the Gulf Stream offshore to deposit their eggs in the warm sands of the beaches. It is not considered unusual to find a nest filled with their eggs along the beaches of Bogue and other nearby banks islands.

Occasionally at this season commercial fishermen catch the giant turtles in nets as they are approaching the beach. The flesh of loggerhead turtle has no commercial value except locally, but many natives consider the meat a delicacy.
