Inspect fuel level and reset if necessary, test fuel pump, clean carburetor bowl and blow out fuel line, reset ignition timing, test vacuum and adjust carburetor, clean and recoil air cleaner. Road test. (Necessary parts extra).

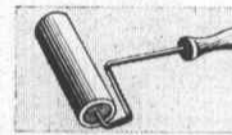
