Men Interested In Patrol Should Apply by May 15

May 15 is the deadline for young men wanting to become state highway patrolmen. Col. James R. Smith, the patrol's commanding officer stated today.

The patrol will start a training school June 1 at Chapel Hill. Between 50 and 75 applicants will be chosen to attend the school and 30 graduates will receive immediate assignments, Colonel Smith said.

Applicants must be between 21 and 31, a U. S. citizen, have no criminal record and be of good moral character, have a high school education or its equivalent, weigh at least 160 pounds, and have no relative now employed by the patrol.

Starting salary for accepted recruits is \$2,688 a year. Trainees will receive room and board but no salary while attending school.

Applications may be obtained from patrol headquarters in Raleigh or from troop headquarters in Greenville, Fayetteville, Salisbury, Greensboro and Asheville. Completed applications should be mailed to Col. James R. Smith, Commanding Officer, State Highway Patrol, Revenue Building Annex, Raleigh, N. C.
