A baseball game between teams of the two Leatherneck bases has been scheduled as the first attraction of the parade of events which will mark the third annual Armed Forces Day celebration.

Game time for the intra-corps classic is 3:30 p.m., daylight saving time. The rival Marine nines will play a regulation nine-inning contest.

The baseball game will signal the close of a day-long program of activities. The gates of the station will be open to the public at 10 a.m., and many visitors will remain aboard until completion of the ball game.

Plans have been completed for the annual cruise of Tar Heels Afloat. Commodore Albert R. Bell, of New Bern stated today that the 1952 Memorial Day weekend cruise promises to be one of the finest programs ever created for the boatmen of North Carolina.

The program includes the rendezvous of all boats at the Morehead City Yacht basin Saturday, May 31 by 5 p.m., a get-together and meet-your-friends session will be held along with the registration at 6 p.m. on the lawn of the basin. At 8 p.m. an outdoor barbecue supper will be served. A street dance for all the visiting boatmen and their crews will begin at 9:30 p.m.

On Sunday morning, June 1, a meeting of the boat captains will be held with Joe McCotter, fleet captain of Washington, N. C., in charge. The captains will be instructed in the formation cruise for the afternoon events which will see the boats cruising in company to Cape Lookout and return. The cruise will depart at 1 p.m. and return at 5 p.m.

The annual banquet and business meeting will be staged at 8 p.m. in the Ocean King hotel at Atlantic Beach. Special busses to transport the 200 expected will leave the yacht basin at 7:30 p.m. The boats will return to their home ports on Monday, June 2.

Tar Heels Afloat is an organization of boatmen in North Carolina. There are no dues to pay and the only requirement for membership is to make a cruise. The set-up is on a dutch treat basis. The 1952 cruise will mark the fifth season this event has taken place. The purpose of the event is to advertise to the world the many advantages of the inland waters of the state, to develop more boating and to create interest in water sports. The flag officers are Commodore Bell, New Bern; Tom Potter, vice commodore, Beaufort; Ed Ward, Wilmington; rear commodore, Joe McCotter, Washington, fleet captain.

Child Labor Laws Affect Farmer

The federal child labor laws prohibit employment of children under 16 years of age in agriculture during the hours school is in session, if the products grown on the farm are to be shipped in interstate commerce.

This is pointed out by Dr. C. B. Ratchford, in charge of farm management and marketing, State College Extension service, who urges all farmers to become familiar with provisions of these laws.

A farmer, says Dr. Ratchford, may use his own children, but he is violating the law if he hires children of his neighbors or others, including the children of migratory workers, during the hours school is in session in the district where the children are living.

The specialist adds that a child under 16 years of age may work on a school day, before or after the hours school is in session, provided the hours worked do not exceed three hours per day or total more than 18 hours per week. Work performed before or after school hours must be between 7 a. m. and 7 p. m.
