 to provide accommodations for several hundred persons.

The North Carolina mountains, with their concentration of centers, becomes the nation's religious capital in summertime. Visitors find the assembly grounds, providing quiet surroundings for study and meditation at organized conferences and offering their own recreational facilities for all ages, ideal for family vacations.

Within a 30-mile radius of Asheville, large centers operated by Methodists, Presbyterians, Baptists and Episcopalians are open from June through August. They welcome guests who want to stay for a night, a week, or a season. Accommodations include inns, cottages, apartments, boarding houses, and dormitories.

Total investment in the assembly grounds over the years has grown toward \$8,000,000, and many thousands more are being spent on expansions, improvements, and new centers.

Several weeks of conferences and study courses bring internationally known ministers, lecturers, artists, and writers to the mountain retreats to teach and learn. Delegates from all parts of the nation and from foreign countries throng to the assemblies.

Recreational opportunities abound. Most centers have lakes where guests may swim, boat, and fish. Hiking, nature study, golf, tennis, horseback riding, and other outdoor sports are close at hand. Supervised playgrounds and nurseries take care of the sinner problem.

Boys' and girls' camps are operated in connection with some of the centers.

Oldest of the assemblies is Montreat, operated by Southern Presbyterians near Black Mountain on U. S. highway 70 east of Asheville. The 5,000-acre grounds contain inns, guest homes, and numerous private cottages which can accommodate 5,000 visitors at a time.

Nearby, directly on U. S. 70, is Ridgecrest, summer home of Southern Baptists, covering 1,075 acres and with hotel and cottage accommodations for 2,000.

Young Men's Christian associations of 10 Southern states operate the Blue Ridge assembly, interdenominational conference center off U. S. 70 a short distance from Montreat and Ridgecrest. It has hotels and cottages accommodating 750.

Lake Junaluska, near Waynesville on U. S. 19-23, is the summer home of Southeastern Methodists. It can accommodate 3,000 in its hotels, apartments, homes, boarding houses clustered on the shore of a 250-acre lake.

At Kanuga Lake, near Hendersonville, Episcopalians of North and South Carolina operate a conference center in a one-time resort development on a 1,200-acre tract. It has accommodations for 500 in a hotel and cottages.

A new conference center is being developed by Southern Lutherans near Arden, on U. S. 25, between Asheville and Hendersonville. Known as Lutheridge, it had its first season in 1951 with eight buildings completed. Others are under construction.

Other centers in the state include Bonclarken at Flat Rock, near Hendersonville, operated by the Associate Reformed Presbyterian church; Ben Lippen, near Asheville, Columbia (S. C.) Bible college; Camp Bearwallow, near Hendersonville, Kings Mountain Presbytery of the Presbyterian Synod of North Carolina; Fruitland, near Hendersonville, North Carolina Baptist State convention; Cragmont, near Black Mountain, Free
