SBI Catches **H&N Burglars**

Craven county law enforcement officials have been notified by State Bureau of Investigation Agent Clyde Fentress that two Kinston

boys have admitted breaking into the H & N Chevrolet Co. at Have-lock March 17. Fentress told Sheriff Charles Berry by telephone Sunday that Ed Sparrow and Edgar Davenport, both of Kinston had admitted the breaking of Havelock as well as break-in at Havelock as well as several others in Eastern Carolina.


