SBI Catches H&N Burglars

Craven county law enforcement officials have been notified by State Bureau of Investigation Agent Clyde Fentress that two Kinston boys have admitted breaking into the H & N Chevrolet Co. at Havelock March 17.

Fentress told Sheriff Charles Berry by telephone Sunday that Ed Sparrow and Edgar Davenport, both of Kinston had admitted the break-in at Havelock as well as several others in Eastern Carolina.

Capture of the two boys came after a wild chase through Eastern Carolina which started in Wilson and continued through Tarboro and back to Wilson.

The Havelock motor company was burglarized March 17 and approximately \$300 or \$400 removed from the safe. The safe was carried from the building by the two boys in a car which was parked in the shop of the motor company and later carried to Bryan's hunting camp and broken open. A crew of workmen found the safe several days later.

Station to Be Park Office

Nags Head—Old Bodie Island Coast Guard station between Nags Head and Oregon Inlet will soon become the administration building of Cape Hatteras National Seashore Recreational Area, Allen Hanks, superintendent of this new and first seaside unit of the National Park System, announced today.

Already the old station building, inactive as a Coast Guard unit since World War II, is undergoing conversion for the purpose it will serve until the permanent administration building is constructed at the northern limits of the National Seashore.

At the present time Hanks, who came here from Everglades National Park to assume his superintendency duties on March 1, is making his temporary headquarters in the Governor White cottage at Fort Raleigh National Historic Site on Roanoke Island.

In addition to converting the old Bodie Island station building into a modern administration building, plans call for building entrance highways and a parking area from nearby Nags Head-Hatteras all-paved highway to the building site.

Butter is Preserved Two Years in Air Tight Can Winnipeg, Man. (AP) — They opened a two-year-old can of butter at the University of Manitoba the other day and it was in fine condition. It had been kept in a locker without refrigeration in temperatures ranging up to 90 degrees.

All you need, says Dr. J. M. Nesbitt is to take ordinary butter, sterilize it and make sure no oxygen is present to make it keep indefinitely in an airtight can.

Thrifty Homemaker Shops With Planned Market List

Shopping to Save—The thrifty homemaker becomes a smart shopper when she shops with a carefully-planned market list. She can save more pennies in her budget by observing these points:

1. Shop in person whenever possible.
2. Shop from store to store for best food buys in price and quality.
3. Read labels to determine quality, size and weight. Consider food use. Less expensive grades of most foods have the same food value and are just as satisfactory for many purposes as more expensive and perfectly shaped foods.
4. Compare relative costs of different forms of food—such as fresh, canned, frozen and dried.

5. Select vegetables and fruits which are plump and firm and without decay. Sometimes fruits and vegetables with only slight, superficial blemishes which can be removed will be cheaper and just as satisfactory for cooking. Wilted vegetables may be an utter waste because they often cannot be used at all.
6. Buy eggs to get the best value under state grading regulations. Strictly fresh, high-grade eggs, although not necessarily the largest size, are preferred when served as a single dish. For casseroles, croquettes, meat loaves and general cooking, smaller eggs are quite satisfactory. The color of the egg shell does not affect the eating quality or the food value, but sometimes affects the price.

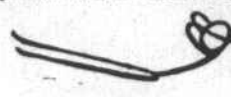
