Salesmen Get Free Vacations

Chicago (AP)— Not only paid vacations but vacations with all expenses paid go to an increasing number of top U. S. salesmen. It has become big business. Industry will pay out about 20 million dollars this year in vacation expenses, says Harold Heister who arranges package vacation contracts for many companies. Salesmen, dealers and their wives have the fun, the companies pick up the check.

Often the people are told: "You can leave your wallet at home," says Heister. Mostly the vacations are given as prizes to those who sell most or who reach fixed sales goals. One firm reports increasing sales 65 per cent during one 61-day period.

Often there are luxury touches — orchids for wives, swank hotels, cruise ships and entertainment. Heister says that some of the best known auto, radio, television and electric appliance companies in the United States are adopting sales incentive vacation plans.

"He also says that slowing of final sales for some heavy industry has increased the use of the plans. The plans are not new. One major firm had a large-scale program in the 1930s. Now dozens of firms are trying them.

In some cases, the companies stage sales convention sessions as part of the trips. But they spent 10 million dollars in 1953 to pay for fun and will double that figure this year, Heister says.

Movie Star Gives Director Credit

Omaha (AP)—Movie star Charlton Heston says:
"You can't tell by watching an actor in the movies whether or not he is good. You can only tell whether he has been well directed. Heston, who has been on the stage and in television as well as the movies, said during a visit here "the actor contributes very little to a movie. On the stage, the story is told with the actor, and the actor is the medium."
A good movie director, Heston holds, can take a bad actor and make him appear adequate, at least, on the screen, for the director is actually the primary creative artist.
Another thing: Heston states he thinks the actor's relationship with the audience — sometimes called empathy is highly overrated.
