Oklahoma City (AP)-Five years ago they were Oklahoma City's forgotten children. Today they are leading better lives because a ragged urchin, many years ago, was dragged to Sunday school by a friend.

The children are the congregation of the non-denominational Children's Church of America, founded by the former ragged urchin, the Rev. L. M. Stevenson, "bicycle preacher."

They laughed when he first pedaled through the streets, coaxing youngsters to Sunday school and riding them there on the han-dle bars. He cut a ridiculous figure, he admits, but there's nothing funny about the change he has made in young lives.
