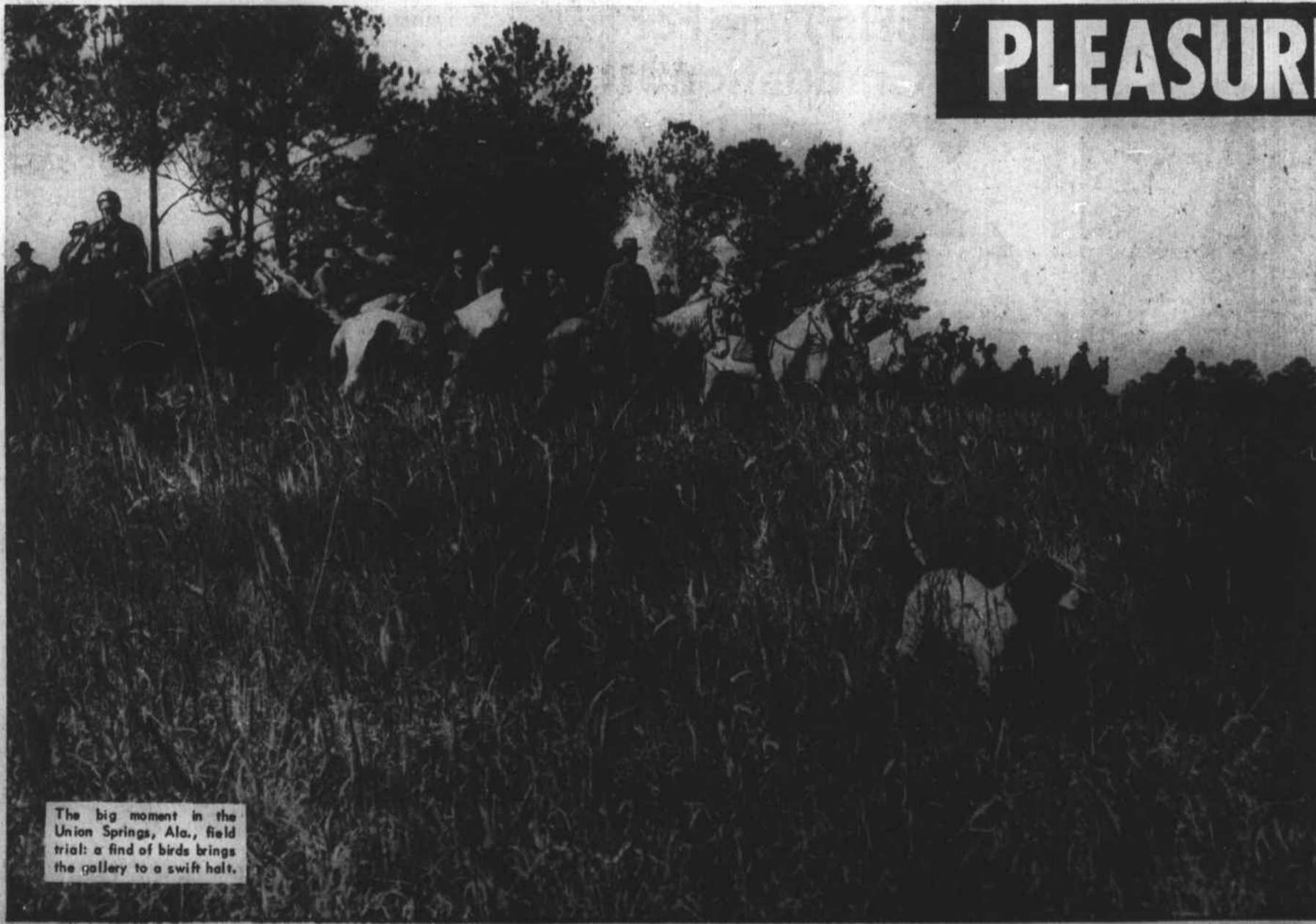

PLEASURE POSSE

At a field trial, everybody concerned has to work for his fun.

Handlers and dogs must perform swiftly and under pressure. Judges put in a ten-hour day. But perhaps the toughest job of all is that of spectator. Most fans are swivel chair jockeys in ordinary life but the only way they can really watch bird dogs do their stuff is to get aboard a horse and ride and ride and ride.

This is particularly true of the National Shooting Dog Championship which is run on L.B. Maytag's big Sedgefield plantation near Union Springs, Ala., each year. It is uniquely a community event. Young, old, rich, poor, city folks and country folks make up the gallery of 200 plus that follow this trial in which the entries are nearly all "meat dogs" (dogs used in the field and not for show purposes). Their handlers must be amateurs.

The community spirit and camaraderie get a running start at a come-one-come all barbecue put on at the town baseball park. For lunch a picnic type meal is served at a tenant house. Each night there are parties in the large homes of the town or at the plantations in the area of this quail paradise.
