Louisville (AP) — Interest in Kentucky's Junior Conservation Clubs, is becoming nationwide. The state's program, developed during the past eight years has moved into secondary schools, with the sanction of the Department of Education.
There are now more than 500 school clubs with a membership of 25,000. About 4,000 of these attend one of the two camps maintained by the conservation department, for one week tours that include short courses on various outdoor activities.
