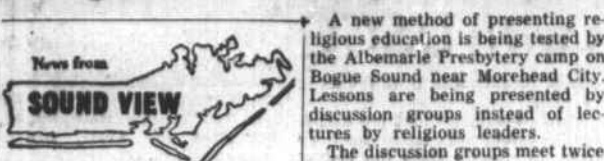

16 Counties Do Most of Business

Raleigh — Various enterprises in 16 of the state's 100 counties last year accounted for 60.9 percent of the total business volume of \$17,953,000,000 done in North Carolina.

These figures are contained in the 1954 Blue Book of Southern Progress, a publication of the Manufacturers Record, Baltimore, Md., and were released today by Department Ben E. Douglas of the Department of Conservation and Development.

The counties, which accounted for \$10,397,000,000 of the State's 1953 total business volume, were Mecklenburg, Guilford, Forsyth, Gaston, Wake, Durham, Alamance.

The 16 counties had 1,804,000 of the state's estimated population of 4,228,000 in 1953 and \$2,610,000,000 of the 1953 total income of \$4,681,000,000, the Blue Book reported.

The per-capita income in the 16 counties in 1953 was \$1,447 against \$954 in the other 84 counties. The per capita income for the state in 1953 was \$1,107.
