#### COMMERCIAL FISHERIES REGULATIONS

The following regulations were adopted at the July 19-21, 1954, meeting of the Board of Conservation and Development at Morehead City, North Carolina, under and in accordance with the regulatory powers vested by Chapter 113, Sections 135 and 136 of the General Statutes of North Carolina in said Board. These regulations have been filed with the Secretary of State of North Carolina, certified copies dispatched by registered mail to the Clerks of the Superior Court of the twenty-one counties having commercial fishing waters and advertised once a week for four weeks as provided by law.

Any violation of these regulations under the provisions of law constitutes a misdemeanor.

#### REGULATION REPEALED

Section 2 of Regulation 1-(109), under "Oysters" is hereby repealed, eliminating the annual license of \$15 on each oyster dredge boat.

#### NEW REGULATIONS OYSTERS

##### SUBSTITUTE REGULATIONS OYSTERS:

"Regulation No. 1—(104) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to take, catch, bed, layout, or float oysters or clams, or for any person, firm or corporation to sell, offer for sale, or have in possession clams or oysters taken, caught, bedded, laid out, or floated at Beaufort, North Carolina, within the following territory: Inside a line beginning at the east end of the highway draw bridge at Beaufort and running westerly along the causeway to the east end of the Morehead City-Beaufort highway draw bridge; thence in a southerly direction along the west shoreline of Radio Island to its southern tip; thence in a straight line to the western end of Town Marsh; thence along its southern shore to the breakwater and the southwest shore of Taylor Creek to its mouth; thence in a northerly direction and 300 feet from Lennoxville shore through Cheney Bay to the mouth of Turner Creek; thence in a westerly direction to the mainland, along the Lennoxville shore and the northern shore of Taylor Creek and Beaufort harbor to the point of beginning."

"Regulation No. 3—(102) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to take, bed, layout, or float any oysters or clams, or for any person, firm or corporation to sell, offer for sale, or have in possession any clams or oysters taken, caught, bedded, laid out, or floated in Bogue Sound within the following territory: Inside of a line beginning on the mainland at Morehead Villa on Bogue Sound and running due south to the south side of the Intra-Coastal Waterway; thence in an easterly direction along the south side of the channel of the Intra-Coastal Waterway to the western end of the harbor at the Port Terminal; thence in a southeasterly direction along the west side of the Beaufort Inlet channel to channel marker No. C17; thence in a straight line to the southern end of Radio Island; thence along the western shore of Radio Island to the Morehead City-Beaufort highway draw bridge; thence in a westerly direction to the Port Terminal; thence along the southern shore of the mainland to Peletier Creek; thence along the shore line of Peletier Creek to the point of beginning."

"Regulation No. 4—(105) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to take, catch, bed, layout, or float oysters or clams, or for any person, firm, or corporation to sell, offer for sale, or have in possession any clams or oysters taken, caught, bedded, laid out, or floated in Core Sound at Atlantic, North Carolina, within the following territory: Within three hundred feet of John W. Smith's boat basin and within three hundred feet of the Atlantic boat basin."

Rules and Regulations Governing the Handling, Packing and Shipping of Crab Meat.

No. 1, Section I; No. 4, 5, 12, 15, Section II; No. 21, Section III; No. 24, 28, 29, 30, 32, 33, 36, 37, Section IV; Amended by striking out the word "crab" and inserting in lieu thereof the word "crustacea".

#### NEW REGULATION SHRIMP

"Regulation No. 8. It shall be unlawful for any person to shrimp at night in an area 1,000 yards wide and approximately six miles long from Swan Point Shoal to the north point of Back Bay in Pamlico Sound."

The best drivers—and the safest—ought to get at least nine correct answers. You have three choices in each question. Mark the one you think is right, then check the end of the column for the correct answers. All set?

1. When the speed of a car is increased from 25 m.p.h. to 50 m.p.h., the braking distance is increased approximately: (a) four times, (b) three times, (c) twice.

2. At 50 m.p.h. a reasonably safe distance at which to follow the car ahead is: (a) 3, (b) 4, (c) 5 car lengths.

3. You are traveling at 45 m.p.h. and wish to pass another car traveling at 35 m.p.h. This

requires about 10 seconds. The number of feet that your car will travel before you have passed and are back on the right side of the road again is: (a) 300 feet, (b) 450 feet, (c) 600 feet.
