Isleta Pueblo, N. M. (AP) - Pablo Apache keeps looking for his uniform and waiting for his pension check - for service as a scout in the Indian wars and the Philippine insurrection. Sometimes late at night, frail Pablo rouses his battle scarred body for a vain search of the room where he rests - too old and too sick to take much interest in other things. He is an Apache Indian.

Mrs. Phillip Lucero, his daughter, says Pablo's life is dimming after more than 100 years. He doesn't know his exact age.

He used to tell of battles against leaders of his people who had revolted against the whites. "He used to say Victorio was a great warrior," Mrs. Lucero recalls. "Geronimo, on the other hand, was just a renegade outlaw."

"I believe he is entitled to an Army pension," says Mrs. Lucero, "but I don't know how to go about getting it. When he becomes restless in the night, sometimes I go in there and he tells me he is looking for his uniform. He seems to be living in the past."

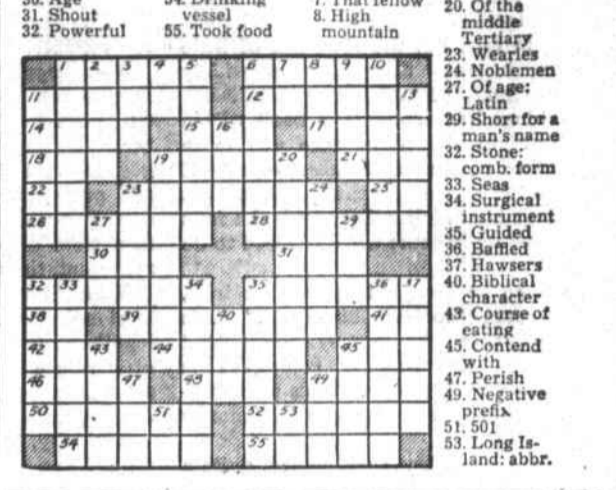
