They were able to produce a high he sto quality product without previous experience in growing aromatic tobacco. Neither had ever seen a crop of this type before producing their own crops. Vaude Hartsell of route 2 Stanfield, in Stanly County produced his first crop of aromatic tobac-co in 1950. Since that year he has The first crop of aromatic totac-co in 1950. Since that year he has increased his arcreage as well as quality, although all of his crops have been of very good quality. He started with less than one-half acre and produced over 2½ acres this year. Mr. Hartsell was able to increase his acreage by adopting improved inhor-saving methods of harvesting and by installing a curing sys-tem recommended by State Col-lege. On his first sale this year, he sold 1,528 pounds of tobacco at an average of 97 cents per pound.
