

Three Vessels Pull Aenos Off

The Coast Guard cutter Agassiz, tug Mamie and the dredge Gerig were used to get the Aenos, a sugar cargo ship free last Monday.

The Aenos, which unloaded a cargo of sugar at Morehead City port, left Wednesday.

Coming into port early Monday morning, March 21, her steering gear went awry and she ran up on the shoal between buoys 5 and 7.

There apparently was no damage to the hull. The Aenos is a Panamanian freighter, 301 feet long, 2,500 tons.

Ministers Admit Negroes To Clerical Organizations

Ministerial associations in North Carolina are opening their doors to qualified ministers of all races, according to Harry S. Jones, executive secretary of the North Carolina Council on Human Relations.

In a recent survey of 20 communities, Mr. Jones found that three communities already have associations which include both white and Negro ministers.

Of the remaining twelve communities which have separate Negro and white associations, five hold joint meetings regularly, and three others hold joint meetings occasionally.

The North Carolina Council on Human Relations is affiliated with the Southern Regional Council, long recognized as the leading human relations organization of the South.

This is only a partial survey but it includes the larger communities of the state, and certainly indicates a trend, Mr. Jones stated.

Long established customs, inertia, and the lack of mutual understanding were reasons given for the failure to take steps toward integration.

and conferences, the Council and its affiliated organizations in twelve Southern states seek to create a better understanding of the human relations problems of the South, especially race problems, and to enlist the intelligent and responsible leadership of both races in the solution of these problems.

The Southern Regional Council is distinctly a Southern organization, to which only Southerners may belong. It was founded in 1943 on the conviction that the problems of the South can best be solved by Southerners of both races who recognize the problems of the region, and who are willing and ready to work together in an atmosphere of mutual understanding and good will.

The North Carolina Division of the Southern Regional Council was reorganized in the fall of 1954, under the name of the North Carolina Council on Human Relations.
