

Official Answers Questions About Easter Seal Funds

Crippled children have sent their personal appeals into the homes of county residents, urging friends who may have forgotten them to mail their contributions off before the 1956 campaign closes Tuesday.

With their plea, a statement by Mrs. Zeb Mauney Jr. executive director of the Carteret County Easter Seal Society, answered questions often asked by contributors to the annual campaign.

Q. Who sponsors the Easter Seal appeal?

A. The annual Easter Seal appeal is sponsored by the Junior Woman's club of Morehead City. It is one of 1,655 affiliated units of the National Society for Crippled Children and Adults located throughout the United States, Alaska, Hawaii and Puerto Rico. The National Society is the oldest and largest voluntary agency serving the crippled. It was founded in 1921.

Q. What is the purpose of the appeal?

A. It secures funds to provide services for crippled children and adults which are not provided by any other organization. The Easter Seal appeal is the only drive in which the society participates.

Q. What direct services does the society provide?

A. Services vary throughout the country, depending upon needs in various localities and upon finances. Your Easter Seal Society in Carteret County provides wheel chairs, purchases braces, pays for hospitalization, speech correction, transportation to and from the hospital, direct medical aid, and supports crippled children's camp.

Q. How does the Society determine which children are to be served?

A. Parents are urged to apply for services for their crippled children whenever they are needed. Other agencies and individuals such as doctors, nurses and clergymen are encouraged to refer crippled children and adults for help.

More than 40 countries are taking part in the 1957-58 geophysical year.

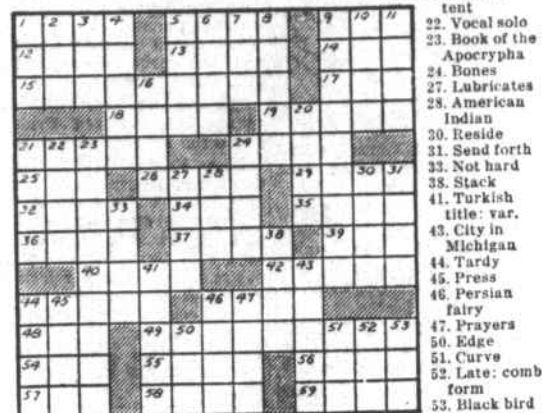

Congressmen, Carteret Men To Attend Miami Meeting

Washington, D. C. — Nineteen members of Congress will arrive next Friday in Miami on the submarine Nautilus to attend the National Fisheries Institute's Eleventh Annual Convention, Francis W. Taylor, Pensacola, president of the institute, announced today.

Carteret County members of the institute who will attend the convention with their wives are Harry E. Gillikin, manager of Carteret Quick Freezing Co.; C. Gehrman, Holland, state commissioner of commercial fisheries, both of Beaufort, and George R. Wallace, owner-manager of Wallace Fisheries, Morehead City.

Congressmen, who will attend the convention to learn firsthand the fishing industry's problems are John J. Allen (R-Calif.), Thomas L. Ashley (D-Ohio), E. L. Bartlett (D-Alaska), John J. Bell (D-Texas), Herbert C. Bonner (D-N.C.), Elford A. Cederberg (R-Mich.).

Jackson B. Chase (R-Neb.), Frank M. Clark (D-Pa.), John Dingell (D-Mich.), Edward A. Garmatz (D-Md.), John C. Kluczynski (D-Ill.), William S. Mailliard (R-Calif.).

George P. Miller (D-Calif.), Leonard K. Sullivan (D-Mo.), T. A. Thompson (D-La.), Thor C. Tollefson (R-Wash.), William K. Van Pelt (R-Wis.), Chief Counsel Ralph E. Casey and Counsel John M. Drewry.

The convention, to be held at the Seville Hotel, Miami Beach, April 14-18, is expected to attract some 800 members of the fishing and allied industries.

Senator Leverett Saltonstall (R-Mass.) will give the principal address at the Monday luncheon meeting.

The convention will open Monday morning with discussions of fresh-water, smoked and cured fish problems, and of an industry-wide promotion of fishery products.

Ralph E. Carr, Mid-Central Fish Co., Kansas City, Mo., and Harry A.

Trimmer Jr., Birds Eye Division of General Foods, New York, are moderators.

Tuesday's events will include meetings on traffic problems, under the chairmanship of Leo Weir, Fulton Fish Market, Louisville, and quality standards, with E. A. Ruthford, San Juan Packing Co., Seattle, as moderator. Cutting and judging of fish and shellfish will also take place that day.

The convention will close Wednesday with the annual dinner dance.

Two other fishery associations are holding directors' meetings in Miami Beach the same time the National Fisheries Institute is convening. They are the Shrimp Association of the Americas, of which Manuel A. Sanchez, Brownsville (Texas) Shrimp Exchange, is president, and the Southeastern Fisheries Association, Berlin E. Felton, A. & B. Fish Co., Key West, Fla., president.

The new Air Force reenlistment program for prior-service men, which began last summer, is producing excellent results, according to Sgt. James W. Davis, U.S. Air Force Recruiter for this area.

It was stressed that prior-service men who have already invested periods of time to the Armed Forces should investigate the Air Force's liberal benefits policy before selecting their permanent careers. "Many will be surprised by the increased pay, retirement and family benefits and up-grading opportunities offered now in the Air Force," the sergeant concluded.
