**Unofficial Report Says Hospital Board May Discuss 'Canned Goods'**

Although no official announcement has been made, it is reported that the Morehead City Hospital board of trustees will discuss at their meeting Thursday night a recent purchase of a large quantity of canned goods by the hospital.

According to a report given THE NEWS-TIMES, the canned goods, purchased from Freeman Wholesale Co., Morehead City, was exposed to a water pipe bursting, but the contents were not damaged.

According to a member of the board of trustees, it was sold to the hospital at cost or below. An employee at the hospital claims that a surplus of the goods is on hand now and an unusually large diet of canned goods has been served patients and the hospital staff.

Efforts of THE NEWS-TIMES to obtain an official report on the matter brought no results during the weekend. David Willis, hospital administrator, said he thought

a statement would be in order but he could act only in accordance with wishes of the board.

He later reported that "several members of the board" whom he had contacted said they had nothing to say.

The Morehead City Hospital is municipally owned and partially supported by funds due Morehead City from operation of Morehead City's liquor store, and a tax levy.

**Car Smashed In Friday Wreck**

A 1948 Oldsmobile was demolished at 11:45 p.m. Friday on the Fort Macon Road when it turned over several times. The driver, Claude R. Johnson, Camp Lejeune Marine, has been charged with careless and reckless driving.

He told State Highway Patrolman J. W. Sykes that he fell asleep. The accident occurred about a mile and a half east of the Atlantic Beach town limits.

Johnson was proceeding east. The car left the road on the right, shot back to the left and turned over several times, landing on its wheels. Another Marine with Johnson escaped injury. The side of Johnson's face was skinned.

**Marine's Leg Broken in Crash**

Donald Quillen, Marine stationed at Cherry Point, sustained a broken right leg at 9 a.m. Sunday when the car in which he was a passenger turned over on the Salter Path Road. The accident occurred two miles west of Atlantic Beach.

Quillen was taken to Morehead City Hospital by a motorist. State Highway Patrolman W. J. Smith Jr. furnished the escort to the hospital.

Patrolman R. H. Brown, who investigated, said that the car which upset was a 1955 Mercury coupe driven by Frank J. Dunn, Cherry Point.

The patrolman said Dunn was proceeding east on the Salter Path Road "at an excessive rate of speed" and failed to round a curve. The car ran off the shoulder of the road and turned over several times, landing in the bushes. The car was demolished.

Dunn has been charged with careless and reckless driving.

**Pastors Consider Migrant Labor Picture at Meeting**

County ministers directed, at their meeting yesterday, that the new president, the Rev. M. P. Garner, work with local organizations and farmers to provide a spiritual and religious life for migrant workers in this county.

This action was taken following a talk by the Rev. Morton Kurtz, a member of the Governor's Migrant Commission. The ministers met at the civic center, Morehead City.

Mr. Kurtz told of the migrant worker in North Carolina and efforts to better their living conditions.

He said trained workers could be sent to this county if this area would cooperate by providing them a place to stay. Other expenses, such as salary and equipment, would not be local responsibility, he said.

Frank Nance, farm labor supervisor, described the migrant labor picture in this county. Other guests were Mrs. Leota Hammer of the county health department, Miss Georgie Hughes, welfare superintendent, and H. L. Joslyn, county superintendent of schools.

Two Morehead City Negro boys, 12 and 13 years of age, were apprehended at 3 p.m. Thursday by George Smith, constable of Morehead township. The boys were given a hearing on theft charges before A. H. James, judge of juvenile court, and have been committed to the Morrison Training School.

Assisting in apprehension of the boys was Patrolman Joe Campbell of the Atlantic Beach police force. According to Constable Smith, the cottage of Mrs. Mary Bryan and the Rochelle cottage, occupied by Paul Baker, were entered.

Sheriff Hugh Salter said the boys would go into homes, while their occupants were out on the beach, and take money.

The two boys have appeared before Judge James on previous occasions for violations of the law.
