



### Postmaster Predicts New Christmas Mail Record

Predicting that this year's Christmas mail will set a new all time record, exceeding the 248,176 pieces of mail handled in the Morehead City postoffice in 1955, Postmaster Harold Webb urges citizens to take the following steps at once:

Check your Christmas card lists very carefully — make sure that each address includes the full name, street and number, city, zone and state.

Then, secure Pamphlet No. 2 at the postoffice, telling you all about Packaging and Wrapping Parcels for Mailing, and Pamphlet No. 3, giving full details on Domestic Postage Rates and Fees. Stock up on stamps at the same time.

Also, ask for free labels reading All For Local Delivery and All For Out of Town Delivery, so that you can speed arrival of your Christmas Cards by sorting and trying them in two separate bundles with the addresses all facing one way.

A modest investment in heavy

wrapping paper, sturdy empty cartons, strong cord and craft paper adhesive tape will pay big dividends in safe deliveries of your Christmas gifts.

If you'd like to include your Christmas cards or letters inside the packages with your gifts, just add the appropriate First Class mail postage to the postage for the packages themselves. This combination mail service recently introduced by the Post Office Department insures simultaneous arrival of your gifts and greetings.

Remember, that only Christmas cards carrying three cents, or six cents air mail postage, may include a personal message. Nothing more than a signature is authorized on cards mailed at the two cent third class rate, and be sure your return address is on every Christmas card envelope—this is socially correct, and helps both you and your friends to keep your mailing lists up-to-date.

After your gift wrapping and packing is complete and your Christmas cards are addressed and stamped, plan your mailings so that those for the most distant points go first. All long-distance mailings should have been in the postoffice Monday and those for nearby points should be mailed by tomorrow.

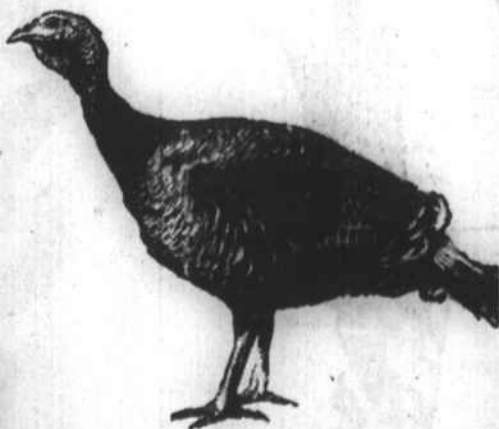
