

Charles Caudell Jr., hospital administrator, said that the new wing will increase the hos-pital's bed capacity to nearly 50. An increase in the nursing staff "is anticipated," he added. The clinic, or medical center,

where doctors will treat patients who do not need hospitalization, will consist of a waiting room, office space and examining rooms for three doctors. At present, patients who wish to
