

# Nurses Exams Set for July

Raleigh—License examinations will be conducted for professional nurses graduated from accredited schools of professional nursing on July 9, 10, 1957, at the Sir Walter Hotel, Raleigh, North Carolina, according to Louise Harkey, chairman of the North Carolina Board of Nurse Registration and Nursing Education.

At the present time there are 34 North Carolina approved schools of professional nursing. Four of the schools of nursing are of the collegiate type of which two will have their first candidates to write the State Board Examinations.

Examinations are conducted two times yearly by the Board. The next examinations are scheduled for October, 1957.

# Firing Exercises Create Hazard For Navigation

The Commanding General, Marine Corps Base, Camp Lejeune, North Carolina, has advised that the area between a point approximately 4.5 miles north of Bogue Inlet to a point approximately 10.0 miles south of New River Inlet, North Carolina, and 21,000 yards seaward within the existing danger zone (US Coast and Geodetic Survey Chart 1234) will be hazardous to navigation because of field firing exercises during the following periods:

6:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., EST, today and tomorrow; 12:00 noon to 3:00 p.m., EST, Thursday; 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., EST, Friday.

All navigation is urged to avoid the above area during the periods stated except for Atlantic Intra-coastal Waterway through traffic which will not be stopped or interfered with at any time.

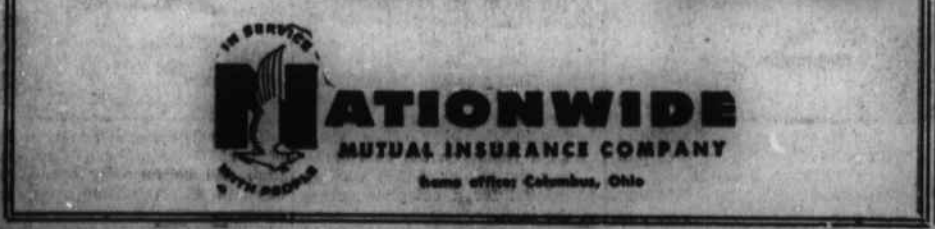
