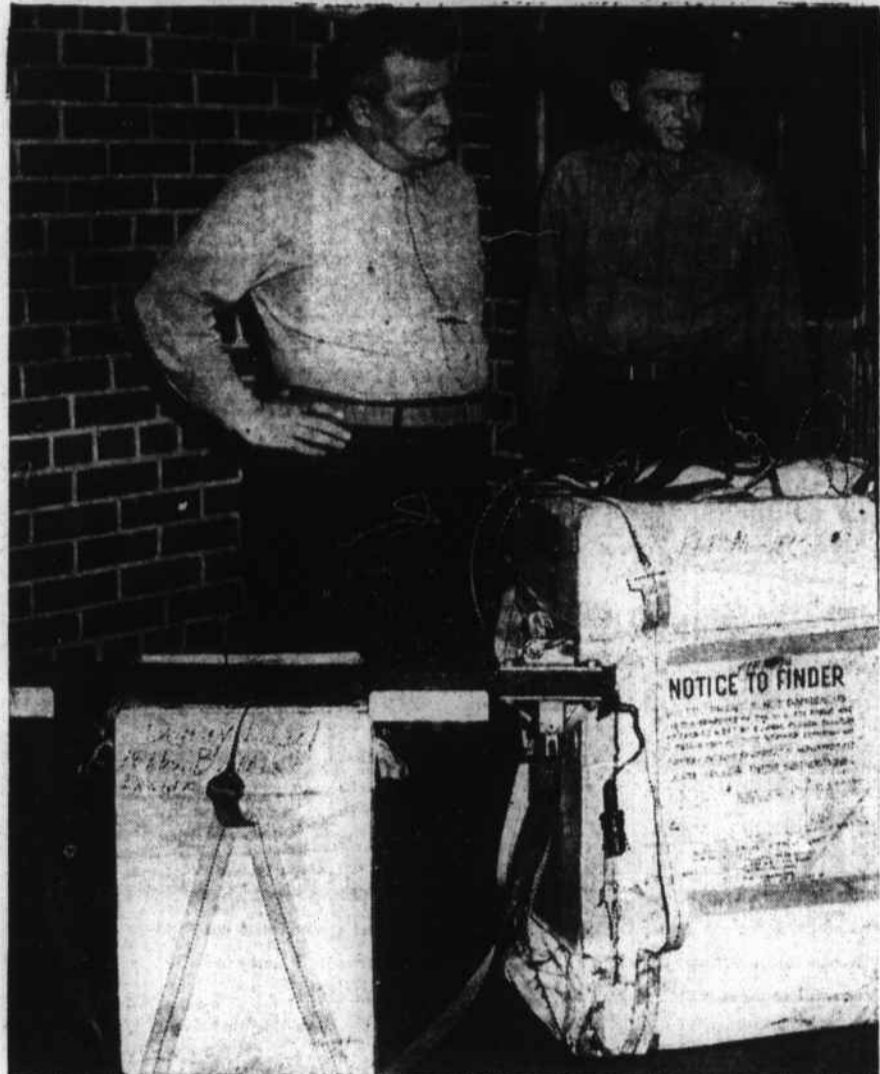


Air Force Weather Instruments Float to Ground at Vanceboro

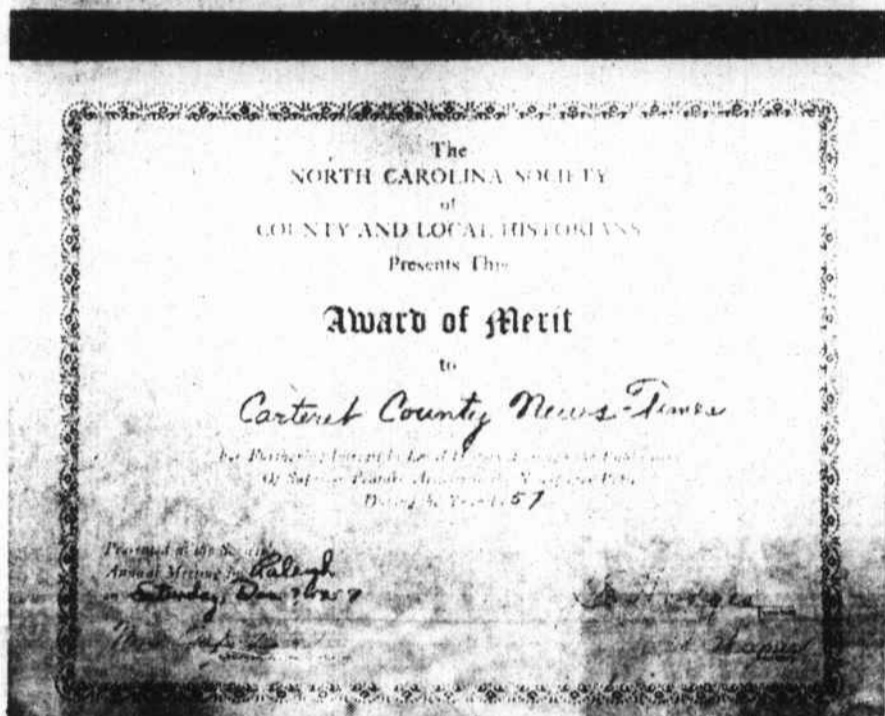
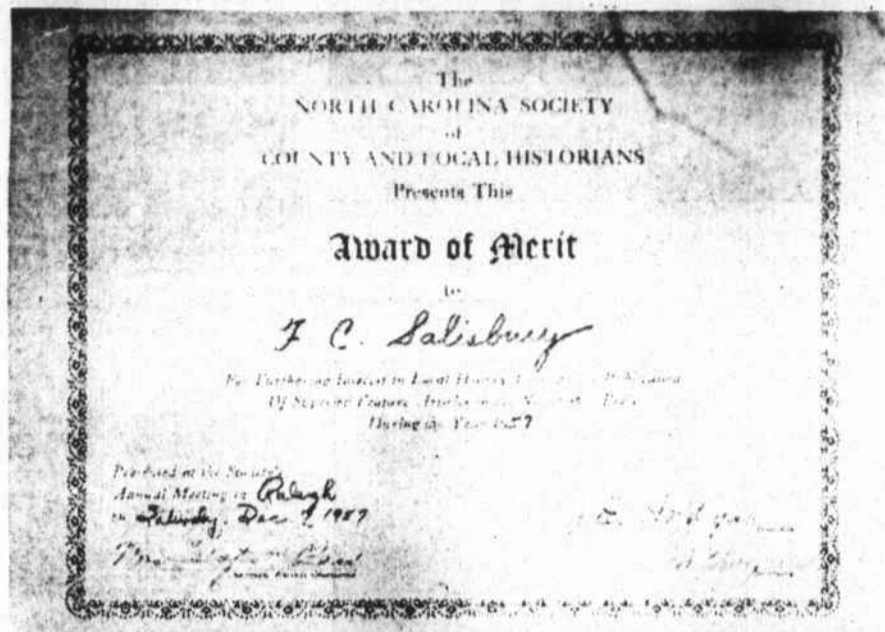
