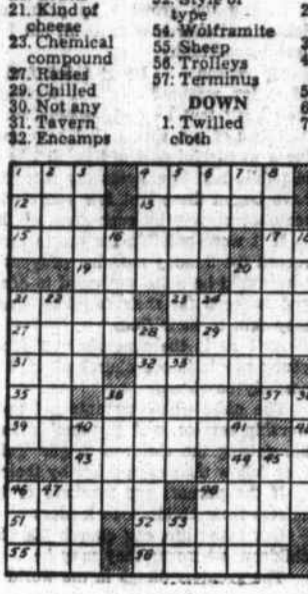

Corporal Allen packs all of the squadron's parachutes every six months and inspects them every ten days to insure that they are in good working order. According to Allen, the parachute loft is currently installing new automatic parachutes in all of VMA-533's "Cougars".

But Lt. Col. C. M. Kunz, Commanding Officer of Marine Attack Squadron-533, who ejected from his F8F "Cougars" jet aircraft last week and made his descent safely in a parachute packed by Corporal Allen, wanted to do more than just shake his hand.

And this week the colonel did more than that, he meritoriously promoted Allen to his present rank because this was the second time in as many months that one of

Allen's packed parachutes had saved the life of a Marine jet pilot.

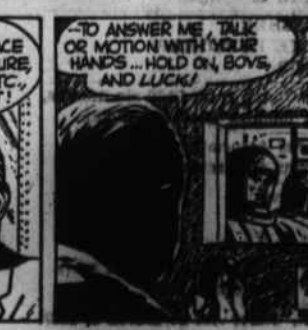
