Billy Corey has been elected general chairman of the program for First Methodist Church. The Rev. Sam Moore will conduct the program for the Franklin Memorial Church and the Rev. Harry Buckingham for the Camp Glenn church. Each of the churches will accept responsibility for certain areas of the city.

It is planned that every family will be contacted and complete information will be discovered as to the affiliation of every person in the community. This will divulge the names and addresses of all people who do not belong to local churches.

Information discovered in the census will be made available to all the denominations of the city through the several pastors. One hundred members of First Methodist Church will serve in this canvass.
