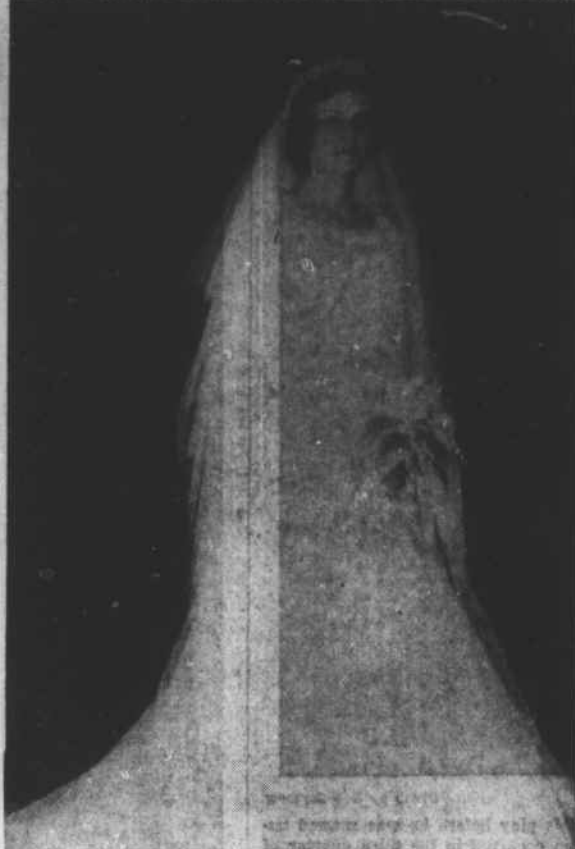

In his address, Congressman Barden paid high tribute to Col. H. C. Rowland of the Army Corps of Engineers, the State Highway Commission personnel and the people of Beaufort and Morehead City.

He contrasted the present day with a period 38 years ago when he said a citizen of Beaufort told him that Beaufort not only wanted to see no bridge between the two towns but wanted a wall so high that the sun wouldn't shine on Morehead 'til past noon!

The Congressman warned that once people give away their rights, they never get them back. This was in line with his advice of caution on looking to Washington "for everything". He said people are frequently urged to vote for anything, as long as they think it will bring them federal dollars.

He said that in his opinion, Washington should keep its hands out of a lot of things. He remarked that even though he criticized the government at times, this country's government is great and worthy of every citizen's interest and support.

After cutting the ribbons, large green and white streamers, Mrs. Taylor was invited to say several words by the emcee. She said, "God bless this bridge... I hope we'll all enjoy it and I will too."
