Good Sweet Potato Crop Begins with Good Seed

Bayers are predicting that if farmers are to expect a reasonable price for their sweet potatoes this year, they must produce a high-yielding, quality crop.

And the best way to produce such a crop, says Foll W. McLaughlin, acting director of the NC Crop Improvement Association, is to start with good seed potatoes.

Use only certified seed if possible, Mr. McLaughlin said. Seed only seed 1 1/2 inches in diameter or over, and examine each potato for scurf.

The Crop Improvement Association has just completed storage inspections of certified seed potatoes for sale.

Mr. McLaughlin reports about 36,000 bushels of Porto Rica and 16,000 bushels of Copper Skin Gold Rusch are available.

Ovid, Colo. (AP)—The first world champion bronze elder? A headstone in a northeastern Colorado cemetery says it was Thad Sower, a Kentucky native, who was buried at Ovid after his death in 1831.

Friends of Sower say the bronze championship first was recognized in 1901 at Denver's Festival of Mountain and Plain.

Sower won the champion's silver belt buckle that year and again in 1802. The next year he was with Buffalo Bill Cody's Wild West Show in Europe.

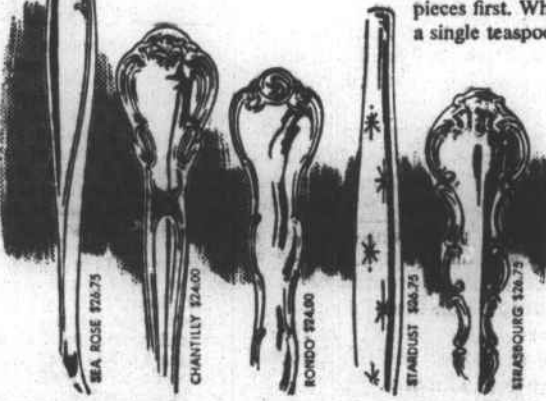
