
per cent interest rate. Although these loans can be made for a period not to exceed

20 years, the actual maturity of each loan will depend on the borrower's ability to repay the loan within a certain period without undue hardship.


Individuals, home owners, large and small businesses, and charit able organizations will be eligible for loans, if such credit is not available through normal lending channels.







Power Goes Off for Half An Hour Yesterday


