Marines Leave Port For Mediterranean

About 1,800 Camp Lejeune Marines, members of the 1st Battalion, 2nd Regiment, plus reinforcements, left Wednesday from Morehead City aboard seven ships for Mediterranean duty.

The detachment, commanded by Lt. Col. S. N. McLeod, will relieve the 1st Battalion, 8th Marines, which has been with the Sixth Fleet in the Mediterranean since last May.

The 1st Battalion, commanded by Lt. Col. N. C. Reifel, will return to Camp Lejeune later this month. The battalion that left last week is expected to visit Sardinia, Crete and ports in Spain, France, Italy, Greece and Turkey.
