Officials Hope To Keep Draw **Bridge Closed**

The Atlantic Beach board of aldermen agreed on a plan of action Friday to eliminate what mayor A. B. Cooper calls a "serious, even dangerous traffic problem."

The mayor suggested to the board that some action must be taken to end Sunday afternoon traffic confusion over the Atlantic Beach bridge. The worst hours, he said, are from 4 to 7 p.m., when beachgoers and sightseers are


