FALL AND WINTER WORK IN ORCHARDS

From now until the end of December is the best time for killing insects in orchards, though the work may be continued during mild weather until the buds begin to swell in the spring. Many destructive insects are held in check only by spraying during the time when trees are dormant, as stronger washes may be used then than when the trees are in leaf. Many insects spend the winter on the trees in the egg, larval or pupal stage, and are more easily destroyed then than at any other time. All necessary pruning should be done before the spraying is begun, as the removal of the surplus limbs and twigs makes the spraying much easier, besides saving material. Of course, the well-pruned trees should be gathered and burned at once, so as to destroy whatever insects may happen to be on them.

Other Sprays Needed.
While this lime-sulphur spray, applied in the fall or early winter, is more effective than is any other one treatment, still it does not kill all insects which affect the orchard. It has little effect on the termites scale of the peach, which should be sprayed with a strong kerosene emulsion, and, as mentioned above, a spring spraying is often needed for the plant lice which attack the apple.

Other Work Needed.
There is other work besides spraying which should be looked after during the winter. There are no leaves on the trees. The falling moth, the cause of wormy apples, passes the winter in silken cocoons under scales of bark, in crevices and in knotholes in the trunk, and trees having rough bark should be scraped with a dull hoe to destroy the hiding places. The tent caterpillar passes the winter in clusters of eggs on the smaller limbs where they are easily seen, and are very easily seen while pruning. The fall web-worm, which was such a pest last summer, spends its winter on apple and other trees, and the flimsy cocoon is easily recognized from the hairs of the caterpillar mixed in with the silk.

Look After Borers.
Peach and apple borers should be looked after at once, as their presence is quickly recognized by the borings which they throw out of their holes. Several grape insects winter among the fallen leaves, which should be raked and burned.
A little work in the orchard between now and the end of December will make a great difference in the crop of next year.

TURN UNDER SECOND CROP SAYS EXPERT

Gain to Soil in Both Organic Matter and Nitrogen Is at Once Apparent.

A ton of clover contains an amount of nitrogen equal to that of four tons of average barnyard manure. At fertilizer prices this nitrogen is worth between seven and eight dollars. A man can cut the first crop of clover for hay and by turning under the second crop, which usually weighs about a ton, he can add this nitrogen directly to the soil. Since on the average soil the nitrogen in that part of the clover plant above the ground comes entirely from the air, this nitrogen is pure gain to the soil.

HOME TOWN HELPS

FIELD STONES FOR BUILDINGS

These Bowlders Are Used Extensively in Constructing Homes in Many Sections of California.

Cobblestones combined with cement are used extensively in the West for all kinds of ornamental and utilitarian construction. From ornamental urns and corner markers to foundations, bandstands, bridges, and even such large structures as two-story houses, churches, and public observatories, many all be found in California, built of the cobbles that are removed in clearing.

The resulting edifices are of remarkably artistic appearance. The economy of this type of building is well shown by the fact that in the citrus belt near Los Angeles thousands of tons of cobblestones are dug up by the Hindu laborers and piled in great heaps between the groves. These cobbles pile up over fifteen feet high and twenty feet broad, and extend for many rods between the cleared fields. They are literally cheaper than dirt.

It is but natural that many of the best specimens of cobble construction are found in that district. The rounded stones merely encumber the ground, and most owners are willing to help pay for their removal to a building site.

In the citrus section may be found an observatory in the grounds of a woman college which is a splendid bit of architecture.

Near by is one of the most attractive homes in the West, a great, rambling bungalow of field stones which has for its main interior feature a sun parlor or glass-roofed porch. This is a most attractive detail of a charming home, with ferns and flowers growing as in a conservatory, but in a temperature suited for its use as a general living room.

In Azusa may be found a decidedly artistic cobblestone church, with only a few roughly squared stones used in connection with the natural-shaped bowlders and field stones. San Diego has two large two-story houses formed of this material, and the suggestion of permanence as well as rustic charm is made by the utilization of the big pebbles.

BE CAREFUL OF HOME PLANS

Don't Forget That Slight Details, Now Overlooked, May Cause Much Disatisfaction Later On.

When planning the new house, as much attention should be given to the things which should not be done as to those which should be done. Unless thought is given to many details apparently slight, but which may cause much trouble and annoyance later, if not properly planned at the start, dissatisfaction is sure to result when the home is completed and occupied.

Some of the things which should not be done, if future convenience is desired, may be avoided by carefully observing the following "don'ts":
Don't set your house too low. Better have it a foot high than an inch too low. The street grade may be raised at any time, and if the house sets low this will make it look squat.

Don't fail to provide proper drainage under the cellar wall and through the center of the cellar, under the concrete floor. This may easily be accomplished by constructing a dry drain or trenches filled with small stone. If this precaution is omitted, a damp cellar will be the result in nine cases out of ten, unless there is a very abrupt slope to the land on which the house stands.

What Baltimore Did.
Which would you rather have, a dirty lot in the rear of your home or a beautiful green garden that produces vegetables, fruit and pretty flowers each year? It is not a hard matter to decide, yet when this question was put up to the people living in a part of Baltimore some few years ago there were many who preferred the dirty back lot. Of course, there were others who desired the pretty garden, and now that the garden is a reality not one person in that neighborhood would take 20 lots for one small section of the green spot.

It was through the efforts of the Woman's Civic League that dirty lots in all sections of that city have been transformed into pretty vegetable and fruit gardens. On the very same spots where boys played ball and people threw bits of rubbish, one finds beds of beautiful flowers and rows of potatoes, tomatoes, peas, beans, carrots, onions and corn every summer. Berries of all descriptions in season, and peach, apple and other fruit trees are also to be found there.

Difficult Job To CHECK FIRE BLIGHT
Only Known Means of Controlling Disease Is to Cut Out All Affected Parts.
The only known means of checking fire blight is to cut and burn all the affected parts before the disease is carried to the rest of the orchard by bees and other insects, or has a chance to spread through the twigs themselves.
The pruning tools may carry the germ if not carefully disinfected by either dipping them into a 1 to 1000 solution of corrosive sublimate, or wiping them with a rag or sponge which has been dampened with such a solution carried in a small bottle for this purpose.
Corrosive sublimate—also called bi-chloride of mercury—may be purchased at any drug store in small bottles containing about 25 tablets apiece with directions for dissolving and making solutions of desired strength.
