Ernest and Richard Howell left Sunday for Johnson City where they will attend Teachers College this year.



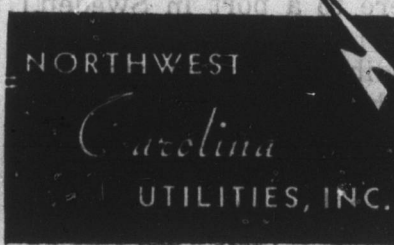
Yancey County Fair

TEACHERS OF COUNTY MEET, ELECT OFFICERS

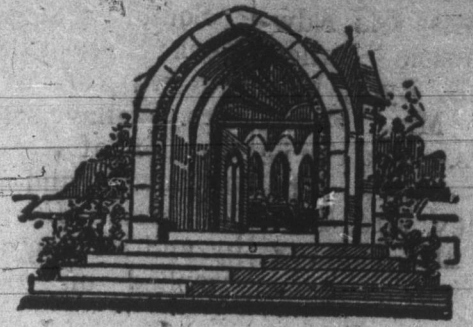
