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THE WOOD THRUSH

The Wood Thrush is somewhat smaller than its kinsman, the Robin. The upper parts are brownish, the crown being brighter than the back. The breast is white with dark brown spots. There is a white ring around the eye.

It is a migratory bird, going south in October and returning in April. Its habits are very much like those of the Robin. When feeding on the ground it runs rapidly for a short distance, then assumes an upright position for a few moments as if to observe and listen, in the same manner as does the Robin. Its diet is mainly insects such as cutworms and moths of various kinds. It is valuable to the farmer and orchardist.

As a songster it ranks next to the Hermit Thrush. "His calm, restful song rings through the woods like a hymn of praise rising pure and clear from a thankful heart. It is a message of hope and good cheer in the morning, a benediction at the close of day."—(James Hutchins).
