#### SAFETY

The old adage to the effect that there is stfety in numbers certainly does not apply in automobile travel, according to Ronald Hocutt, director of the North Carolina Highway Safety Division.

"Happiness is the keynote when a group of young people pile into an automobile and start off to the fair or a football game, or on some other short trip, but if they overcrowd the car, grief may soon enter the picture," said the safety director.

Hocutt pointed to the recent\_accident in which an automobile loaded with eight young people overturned while enroute to a high school football game, injuring four of the boys killing two.
