Home visits by nurses to prenatals totaled 419.

Eye Clinics

Five eye clinics were held in the District during the year with a total of 182 fitted with glasses.

Physical examinations, health certificates issued to WPA workers, NYA, 4H clubs, midwives, food handlers, and teachers totaled 843.

The sanitary officer made a total of 169 visits to food handling establishments during the year. Twenty inspections of dairies, and 959 visits to private premises in the interest of sanitation. A total of 565 sanitary privies were installed.

Many other phases of the public health work not listed here are carried on. The general health of the two counties has been quite satisfactory during 1941, the sickness due to preventable disease has shown a gradual decrease.

Dr. J. J. Croley is district health officer; Mrs. Elizabeth H. Crouse is public health nurse for Yancey county and Mrs. Morrison Craven for Avery county. T. G. Ellis is district sanitarian.

The meeting adjourned at 3:30 P. M.

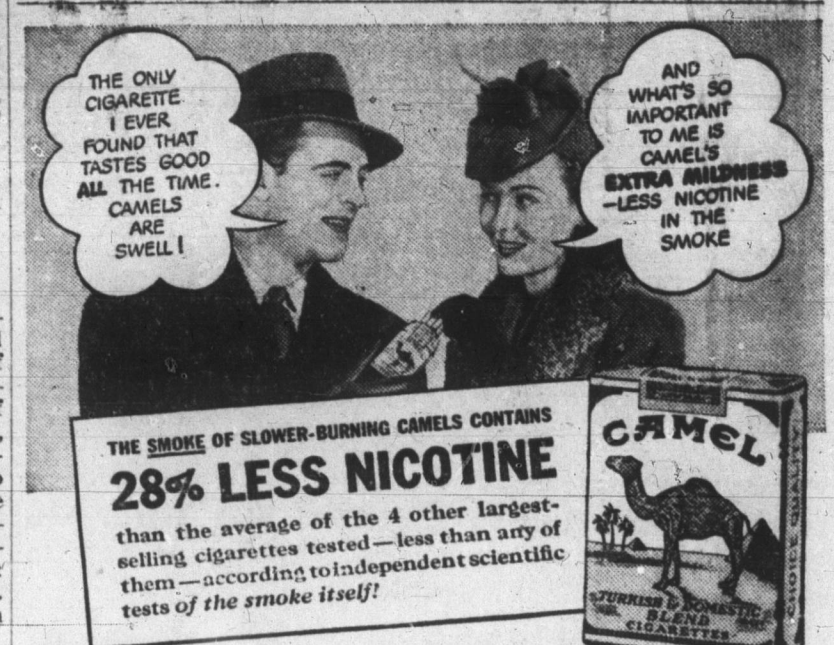
