The Hortons had five children. Their oldest son, Earl Leon Horton, was killed in France in World War I. He was the first soldier from the county to lose his life in action, and the local Legion post is named in his honor.

The four children now living are Roy D. Horton, Bryan Horton and Mrs. J. W. King, all of Alexandria, Va., and Mrs. Annie Marsh of Charlotte. They have nine living grandchildren and one great granddaughter. One grandson, Leroy D. Horton, died in 1935.
