Mrs. Lester Byrd is visiting her daughter in Asheville.

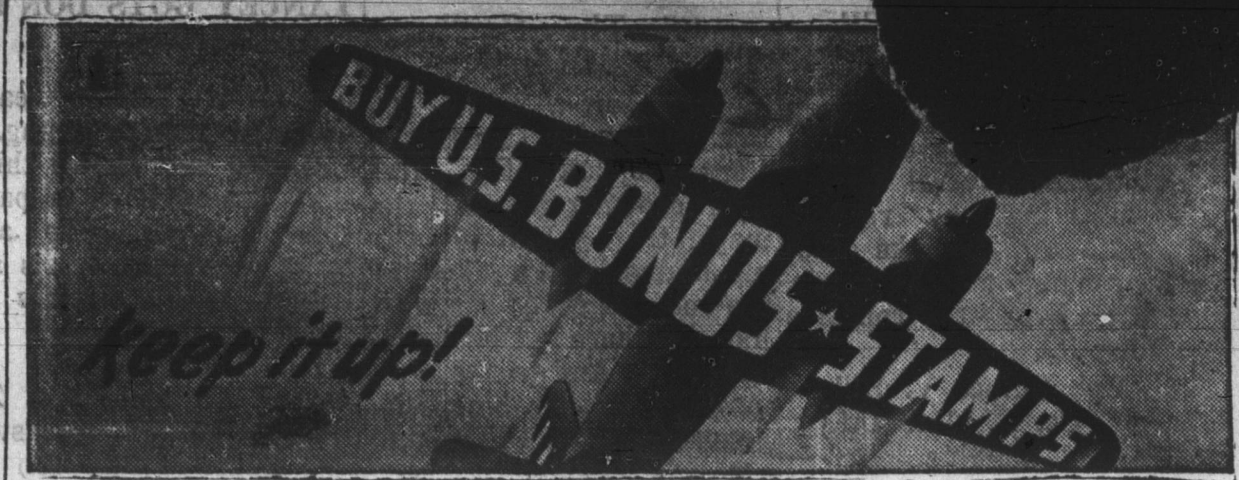
