WHAI WILL NUKIH CARULI **ABOUT THIS PULPWOOD SHORTAGE?** 

Latest reports show North Carolina has fallen behind in its response to the government's appeal for more pulpwood. The situation is so acute that some North Carolina pulp mills might shut down.
