Sweetens Soil

TAKE THIS MOM, ILL ALKALIZE YOUR SOUR TUMMY.



Is your soil suffering from acid indigestion? Alkalinize it with limestone! It "sweetens" the land as it helps phosphates, nitrogen, potash and other nutrients to do their work of building up the soil. Improving the soil improves the quality of the food and feed it produces, according to the War Food Administration. Forage production, for example, was reported to have increased 57 percent on a group of West Virginia farms from the application of limestone and triple superphosphate. At the same time, the protein content of the forage increased more than 40 percent. Bigger and better crops in 1945 call for making the most of available supplies of limestone. Application of lime is one of the best farm practices for which assistance is available under the agricultural conservation program administered by the Agricultural Adjustment Agency.

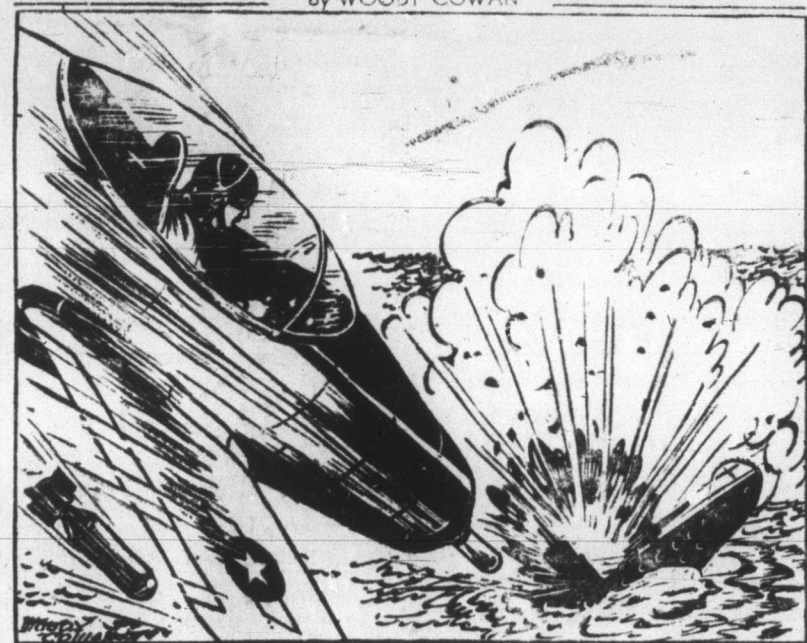
