More about — FSA NEWS

The custom of the old American of working together. The idea is similar to "barn raisings", "husking bees" and "quilting parties". In some instances there are not enough FSA borrowers or other small farmers in a community to support a joint service, in such cases farmers not on the program or not in the FSA classification may use the services, but it is FSA's policy that this is a part of a service for small operators. Group service loans are made to individuals for practically any farm or home facility or service that can be used by two or more farm families on a sound financial basis. Loans are repayable in three to five years at five per cent interest.

Trend to More Machines

The increase in the number of tractors on farms the past few years is an example of the trend toward more machinery. Mr. Ray said. In North Carolina in 1930 there were 11,426 tractors on farms. By 1940 the number had increased to 12,756, and in 1945 the total was 20,300, according to the Bureau of Agricultural Economics. The average age of tractors in 1940 was 9 years. The increase in tractor drawn and operated equipment is about the same.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE NEW ENLISTMENT PROGRAM

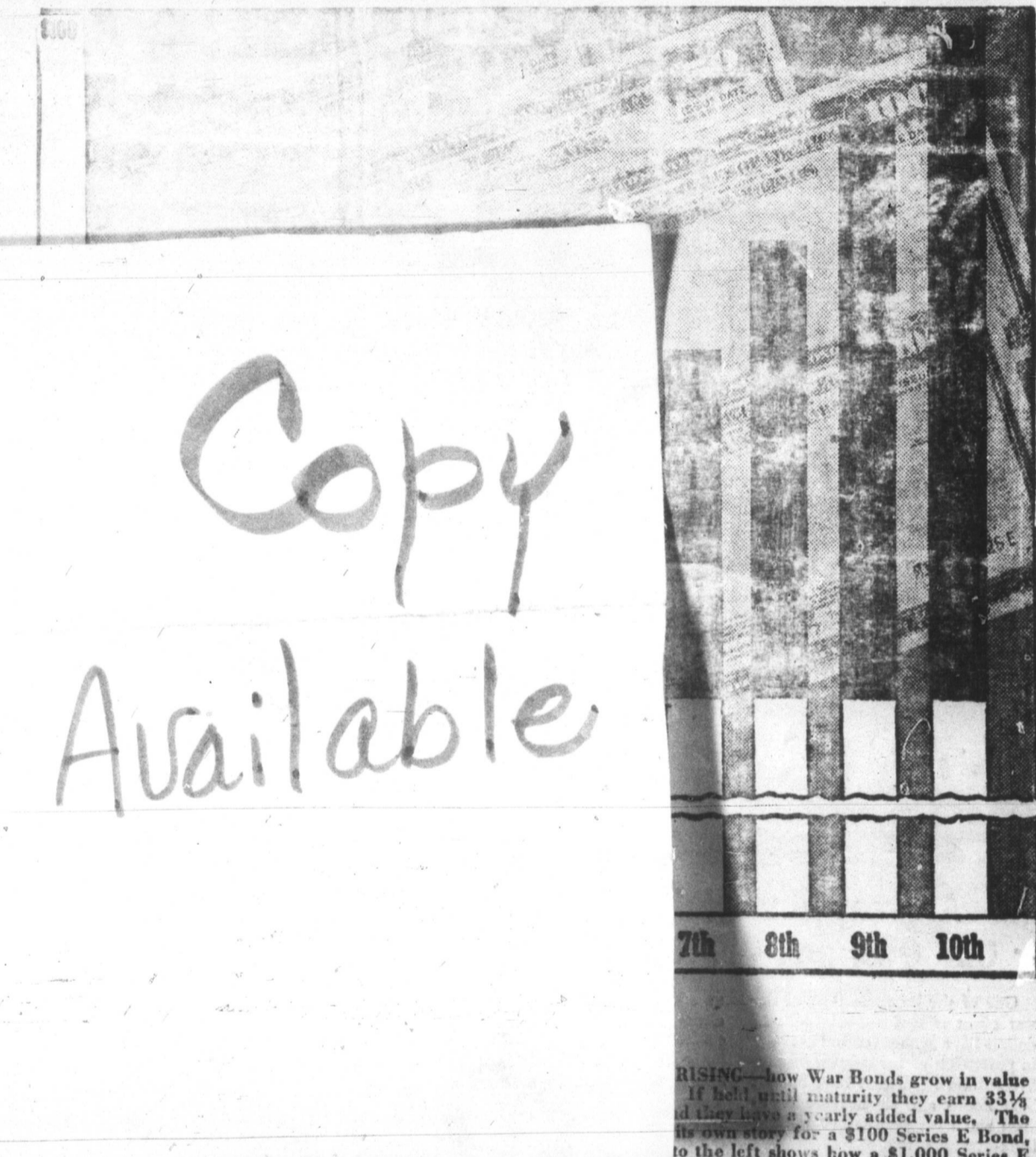
- Enlistments for 1½, 2 or 3 years. (1-year enlistments permitted for men with 6 months' service.)
- Men reenlisting retain their present grades, if they reenlist within 20 days after discharge and before Feb. 1, 1946. The same applies to men discharged between May 12 and Nov. 1, 1945, who reenlist before Nov. 21, 1945.
- An increase in the reenlistment bonus to \$50 for each year of active service since the bonus was last paid, or since last entry into service.
- 20% extra pay when overseas.
- Paid furlough, up to 90 days, depending on length of service, with furlough travel paid to home and return, for men now in the Army who enlist.
- Mastering-out pay (based upon length of service) to all men who are discharged to reenlist.
- Option to retire at half pay for the rest of your life after 20 years' service—or three-quarters pay after 30 years. (Retirement income in grade of Master or First Sergeant up to \$155.25 per month for life.) All previous active federal military service counts toward retirement.
- Benefits of GI Bill of Rights.
- Family allowances for the term of enlistment for dependents of men who enlist or reenlist before July 1, 1946.
- Choice of branch of service and overseas theater in Air, Ground or Service Forces on 3-year enlistments.
