Since many farmers will ine Pleasant during the since their last entry into be storing fertilizer this winter, which will be needed for next spring's crops, Dr. Emerson Collins, in charge of Extension Agronomy at State College, makes the following suggestions for protecting the fertilizer and keeping it in good condition.

> "Place the fertilizer in a good, dry place," says Dr. Collins, "rather than under open sheds where rain may blow in on it or where it will absorb moisture. Fertilizer must be kept dry, if it is to remain in perfect condition, just as it is delivered by the manufacturer.

> "Do not put it on the ground or on a concrete floor," is another suggestion made by Dr. Collins. "If it is put on some logs and kept off the ground, it will remain in much better condition. Also it should not be stacked too high, as the bags on the bottom may become packed.

"During the winter the fertilizer should be examined once or twice. If it shows any signs of hardening, simply drop the bags to the floor and then pile the fertilizer again. If the other suggestions have been followed, this is not very liable to occur.
