### FARM WORK

These five areas and the 141 unit farms used 270.75 tons of TVA concentrated phosphate and 45 tons of ammonium nitrate. Also, of the 2242 tons of ground limestone used by all farmers thru the AAA program, these unit and area farmers used 1381 tons of 61.6 per cent of the total used.

One farmer was assisted in purchasing an ensilage cutter mounted on rubber tires and he custom filled a total of 18 silos for as many farmers.

A series of joint farm and home meetings were participated in that included home wiring, insulation, building and water systems.
