PULPWOOD RECEIPTS
MAY FALL SHORT OF
RECONVERSION NEEDS

Total pulpwood receipts in 1946 may fall far short of the volume required to meet the needs of industry during the same period, according to a consensus of opinion among members of the American Pulp and Paper Association who attended the 69th annual meeting of the group recently in New York.

Predicting that total pulpwood receipts might drop 500,000 cords below the receipts obtained in 1945, industry spokesmen stated "these predictions would become a certainty unless the volume of woods workers is increased considerably."

With the peeling season approaching, mills in this area will soon require peeled top quality pulpwood. Peeled wood pays higher prices.
