PULPMILLS GIVE 19 MILLION TREES TO 6,000 LANDOWNERS During the four year period commencing in 1941 through 1945 the pulp and paper industry of the South has purchased and distributed free of charge 19 million forest tree seedlings to nearly 6,000 timber landowners in the South. The nine mills with one exception, and one pulpwood producer thus far participating in the program are members of the Southern Pulpwood Conservation Association, according to its Forester, H. J. Malsberger. None of these seedlings have been planted on lands owned by the mills. They have been given to farmers and small timber landowners and planted on worn out or abandoned farm land or on understocked or depleted forest lands. Thus this industry is taking positive action in helping to renew the forest resource. The trees have been mostly one year old pine seedlings produced in the forest nurseries operated by the State Forestry Department.

It is the goal of the Red Cross to see that at least 10 percent of the women population take the Red Cross home nursing course. More than two dozen new crop plants have been developed in the past year by United States pathologists.
